



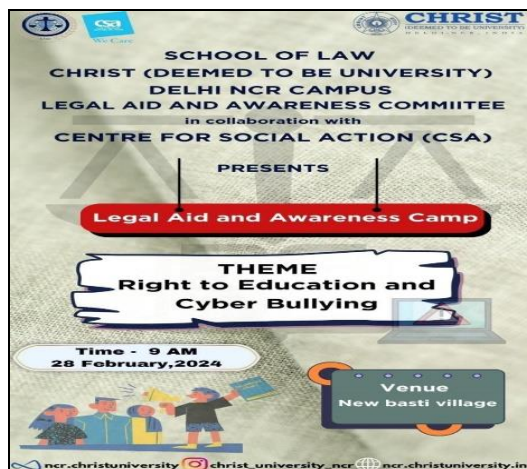

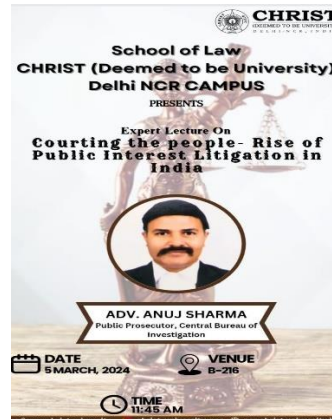
## LAAC NUKKAD NATAK on 28 FEBRUARY, 2024



- **The Legal Aid and Awareness committee** set up their new camp in one of the schools of Nai Basti based on the theme "**Cyber Bullying and Right to Education**". A **LEGAL AWARENESS CAMP (NUKKAD NATAK)** was organized on 28 FEBRUARY, 2024 at NAI BASTI, GHAZIABAD, UTTAR PRADESH. This event was organized in collaboration with Centre for Social Action (CSA).
- Distinguished guests were invited to enrich the event, providing insights on cyber-crimes and available avenues for assistance. 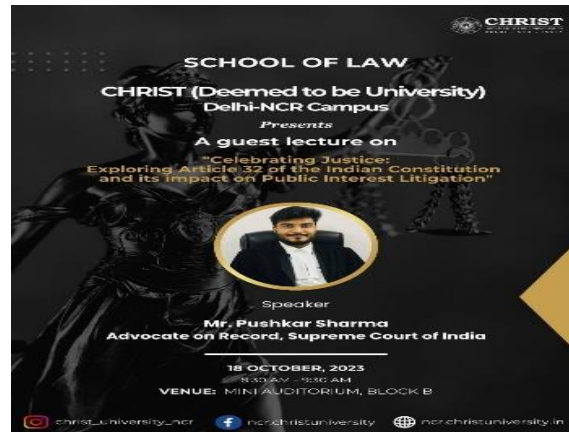


**EXPERT LECTURE On Courting the People- Rise of Public Interest Litigation in India by Adv. Anuj Sharma (Public Prosecutor, Central Bureau of Investigation) on March 5,**



- An expert lecture was organized by **School of Law, Christ (Deemed to be) University, Delhi NCR on 5th March, 2024**. The speaker of the event was **Adv. Anuj Sharma** who is the Public Prosecutor of **Central Bureau of Investigation**.
- The expert began his lecture by highlighting how the concept of **Public Interest Litigation** emerged in India. He further explained the concept of locus standi and how it is relaxed in the case of PIL. The concept of judicial activism was discussed in detailed. The expert further dealt with the procedure of filing the PIL detailing who can file the PIL, in which Court can it be filed?
- The landmark cases on the point such as **Hussainara Khatoun v State of Bihar, S.P. Gupta v UOI, MC Mehta v UOI, Vishaka v State of Rajasthan, Bandhua Mukti Morcha** etc. were critically analysed. The lecture was concluded by discussing the significance and criticism of the concept of **PIL**. The simplified language used by the expert helped the students to understand the concept with ease. The **interactive Q&A session** further allowed students to clarify their doubts, fostering critical thinking and encouraging active engagement with complex legal issues. This session not only **expanded their academic knowledge** but also inspired them to consider the broader social implications of their future legal careers.

- The discussion was around celebrating justice through **Article 32 of the Indian Constitution** and its impact on Public Interest Litigation encompasses constitutional principles, access to justice, the role of the judiciary, and its effects on Indian society. **SDG Goal 16 and Accessible Judicial System and peaceful dispute resolution through ADR** were discussed.
- The event's focus on the societal impact of Article 32, including its role in **environmental protection, minority rights, and government accountability**, emphasized its importance in driving positive social change. Overall, the session fostered a deeper appreciation of the legal framework's potential to promote justice and protect individual rights, leaving a lasting impression on the attendees.

**Guest Lecture on Guarding Liberties: Understanding the

Mr. Preshit Surshe who is an Advocate on Record, Supreme Court of India was invited as the speaker.
- The programme began with the guest speaker introducing the detailed and the practical aspect of Article 20 along with Public Interest Litigation.
- Mr. Surshe’s insights on the **protection against double jeopardy, the right against self-incrimination, and the prohibition of retroactive penal laws** highlighted the importance of these principles in upholding the rule of law and safeguarding individual rights. His explanation of how these protections align with international legal standards, such as those found in the **Universal Declaration of Human Rights**, deepened the students' appreciation of India’s legal framework and its commitment to human rights. He then engaged in Q&A with the students.
- The event concluded with a vote of thanks by **Mr. Sandeep T.M.**, who acknowledged the value of the knowledge imparted. The session not only enhanced the participants' understanding of Article 20 but also underscored **the relevance of constitutional safeguards in protecting civil liberties**.
