

#### "SHAPING KNOWLEDGE SOCIETIES THROUGH HIGHER EDUCATION" (INDIA / ASIA)

After the announcement, we got an overwhelming response and received 16 abstracts and full-length papers from across the country and abroad. All the papers had gone through a rigorous review process. And our review committee finally selected 8 papers for presentation. Around 350 participants across the world attended and participated in the conference. The conference includes paper presentations, workshops, key note panels and symposiums on a variety of topics to understand and review the best practices in Shaping Knowledge Societies through Higher Education.

As human beings are social beings, knowledge is generated and shared through a collective effort and is for the well-being of all. We are members of "Knowledge Societies" who generate, communicate and make available knowledge that brings justice, solidarity, democracy, peace, and well-being to all members of society.

The tone of the two days conference was set by Ms Rajula V National Officer, GE India. The opening remarks of Rev. Fr. Jose Nandhidkkara, the National Director of Globehtics.net India was on the great wisdom, thought and initiative that is behind this three-conference series. Then we listened to the thematic talk by Monsignor Prof. Dr. Obiora Ike, the executive director of Globethics.net, Geneva, Switzerland. The keynote address was delivered by Rev. Dr Christoph Stuckelber, the founder and Director of Globethics.net, followed by a talk delivered by Dr Meera Baindur, the Associate Professor at RV College, Bengaluru. We had Fr. Viju P D, the Dean and Director of Christ (Deemed to be University), Delhi – NCR to felicitate the event. Later, Prof. Dr. Julio Durand, the Academic Secretary at the University of Austral, Argentina shared some of the highlights of the first conference that was led by Globethics.net. South America region. We had two reactors, Dr Amele Ekue, the Academic Dean, Globethics.net, Geneva, Switzerland and Dr Bejay Bolivar, the Director for Curriculum and Planning, Cebu Technological University, Philippines. There were four research paper presentations by Dr Dennis P McCann, from the Philippines, Prof.Dr. Benoit Giradin, from Geneva, Switzerland and James Coder from North Carolina respectively.

On day two, Prof.Dr. K. Pushpanadham, Faculty of Education and Psychology, M.S.University of Baroda, Gujarat, India delivered a talk on the topic "The Future of Learning in Higher Education: Global Trends". Later, the second talk on "Ethical issues in educational research management and practice" was delivered by Dr Tony Sam George, Dean, School of Social sciences. To discern the role of research Ethics in Higher Education, Dr Luis Miguel, Portugal Adjunct Professor, at the Centre for Comparative Studies of the University of Lisbon, Portugal delivered a talk on the theme, Shaping Knowledge Societies: Social Responsibility as a core contribution of Higher Education Institutions.

There were four paper presentations by Dr Prof. Dennis P. McCann, from the Philippines, a joint paper by Sandra Posada-Bernal and her colleagues from Colombia, Rr. Manda Andrian from Indonesia, and Dr Shnaoli Chakraborty Acharya from India. We had two reactors for the day, Prof.Nereogilbert de la Cruz, from CTU Philippines and Dr Ridhima Shukla, Christ (Deemed to be University) from India. A short virtual tour of Cebu Technological University, Cebu City, Philippines was held and lastly, the event was closed with Fr. Jose Nandhikkara's closing remarks.

Towards the moon in contemplation


All she loved, she loved alone




## **CONVOCATION 2022**
