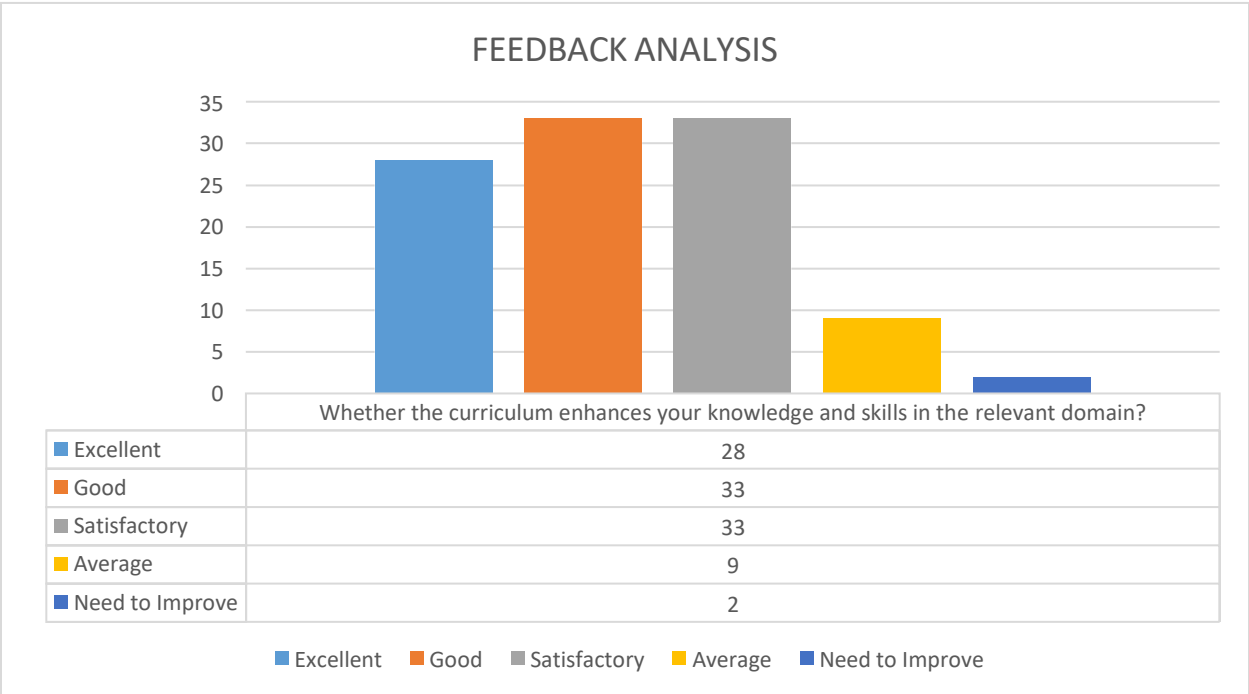

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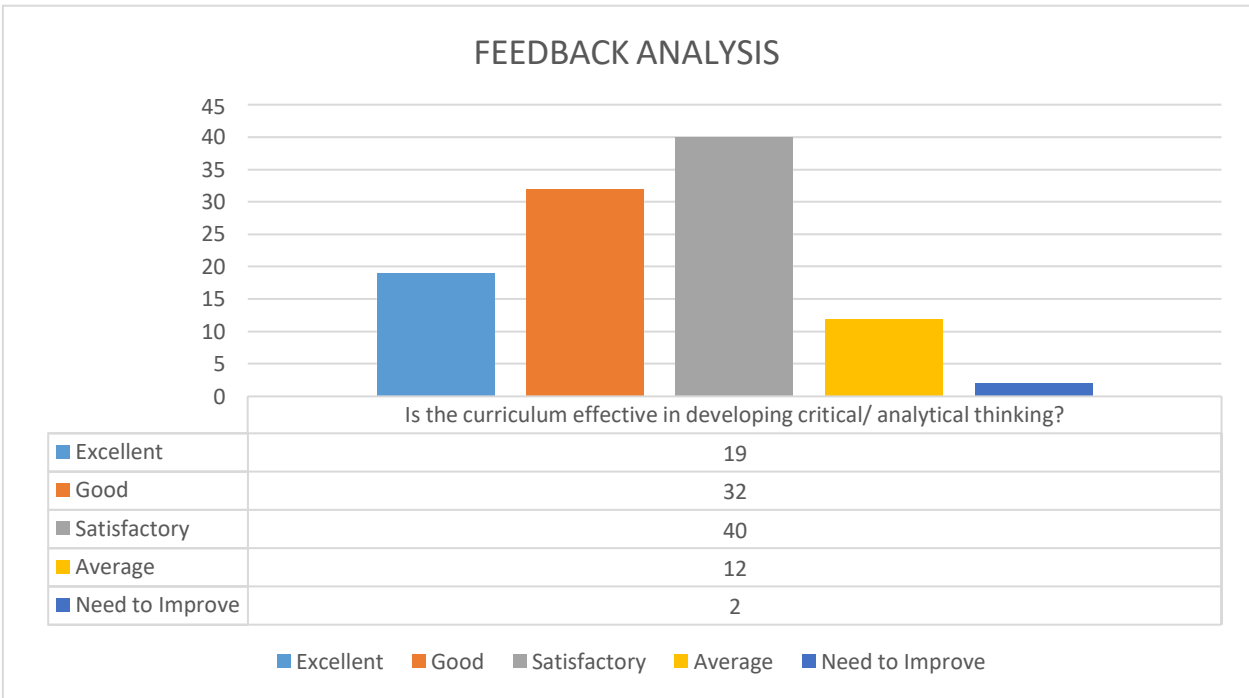
Question 1: Does the Content of the curriculum satisfy the stated objectives and learning outcome?



Question 2: Does the Curriculum cover advanced topics?

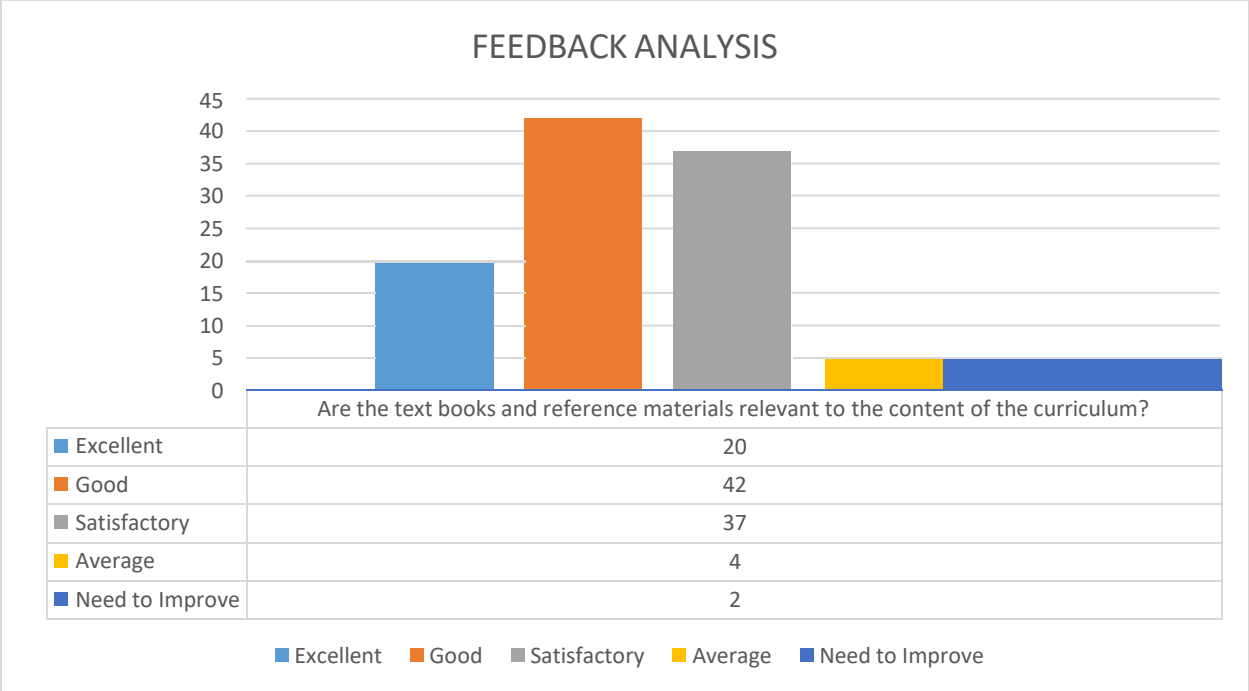


Question 3: Whether the curriculum enhances your knowledge and skills in the relevant domain?

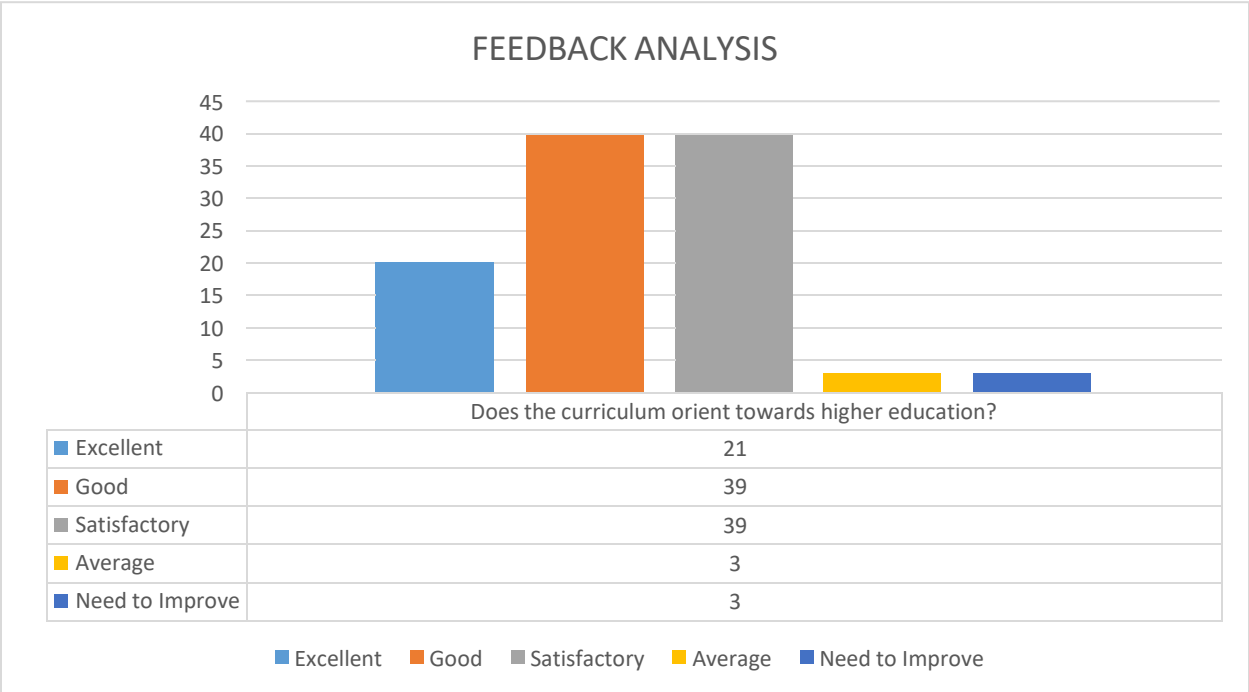


Question 4: Is the curriculum effective in developing critical/ analytical thinking?

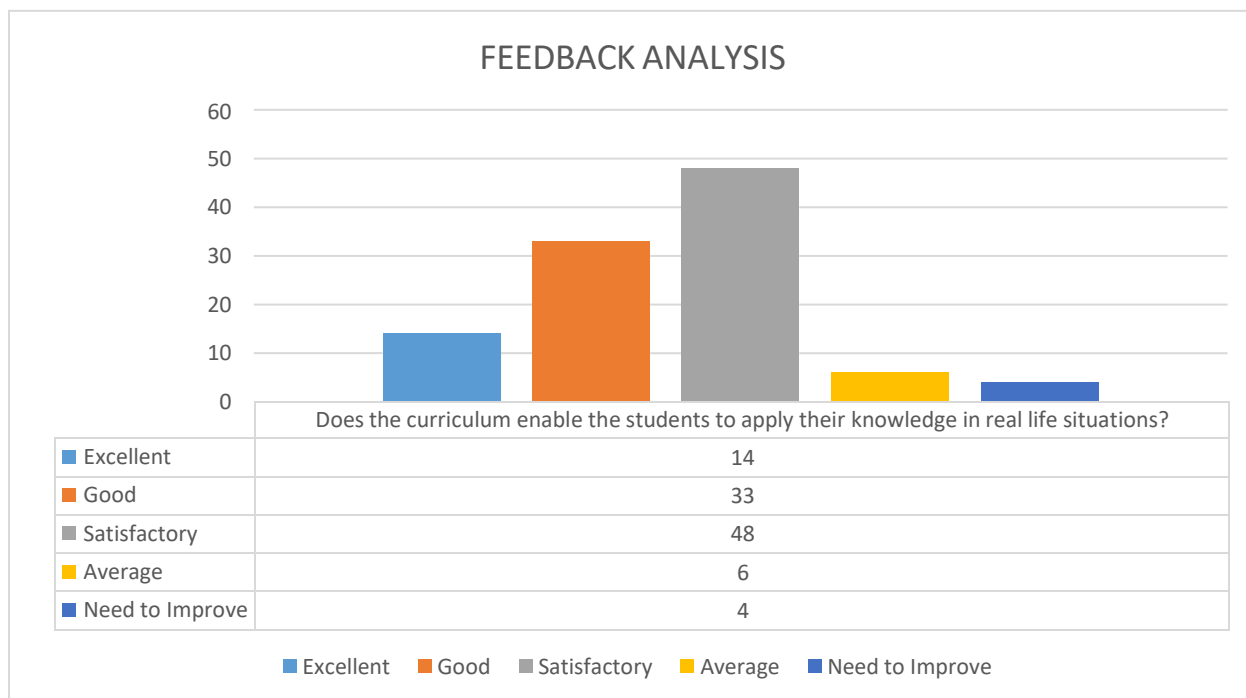

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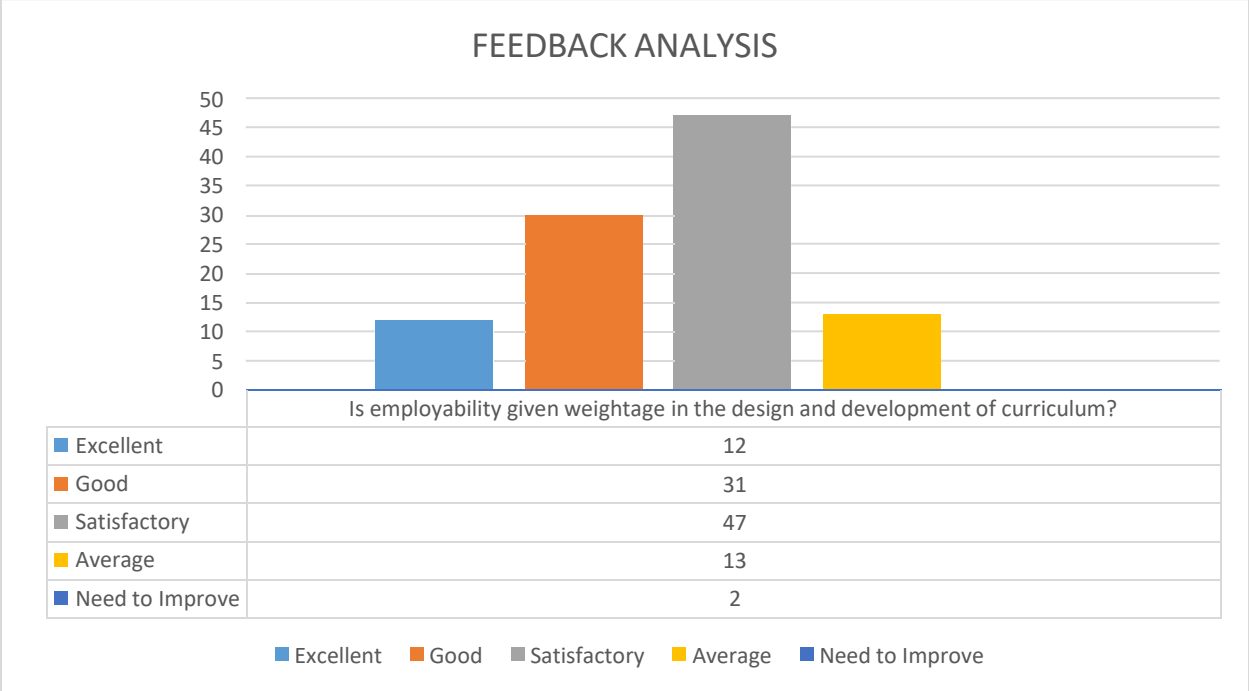

Question 6: Does the curriculum orient towards higher education?

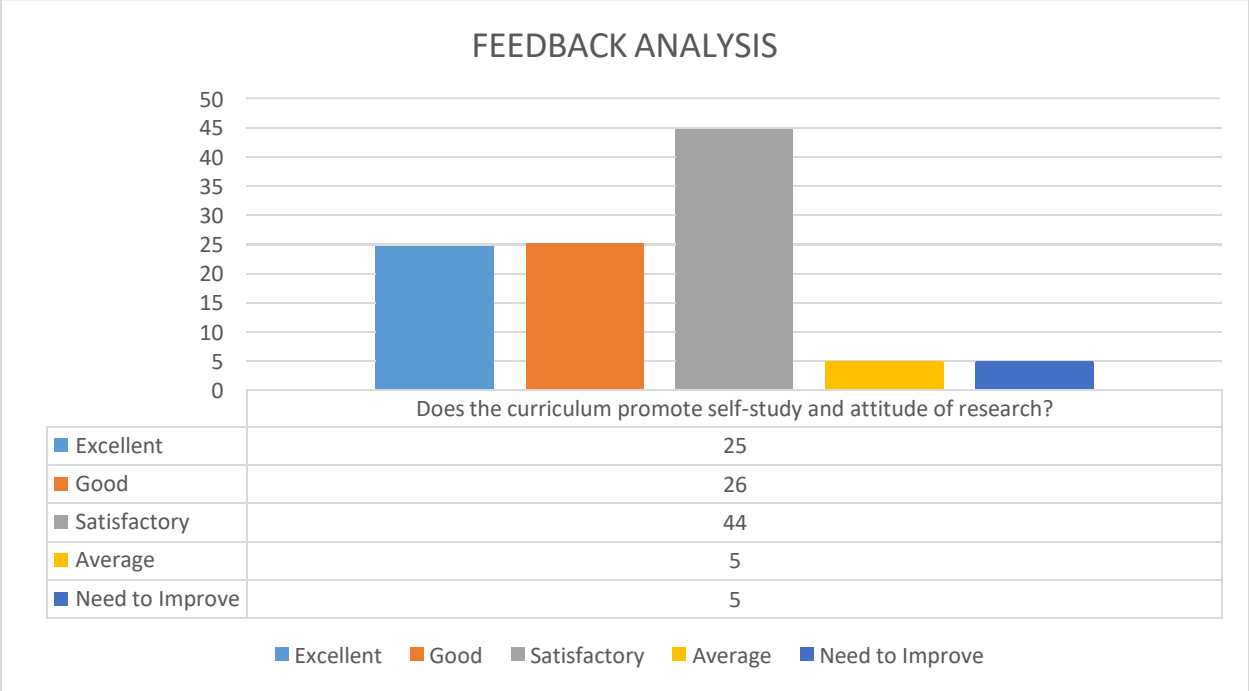


Question 7: Does the curriculum enable the students to apply their knowledge in real life situations?

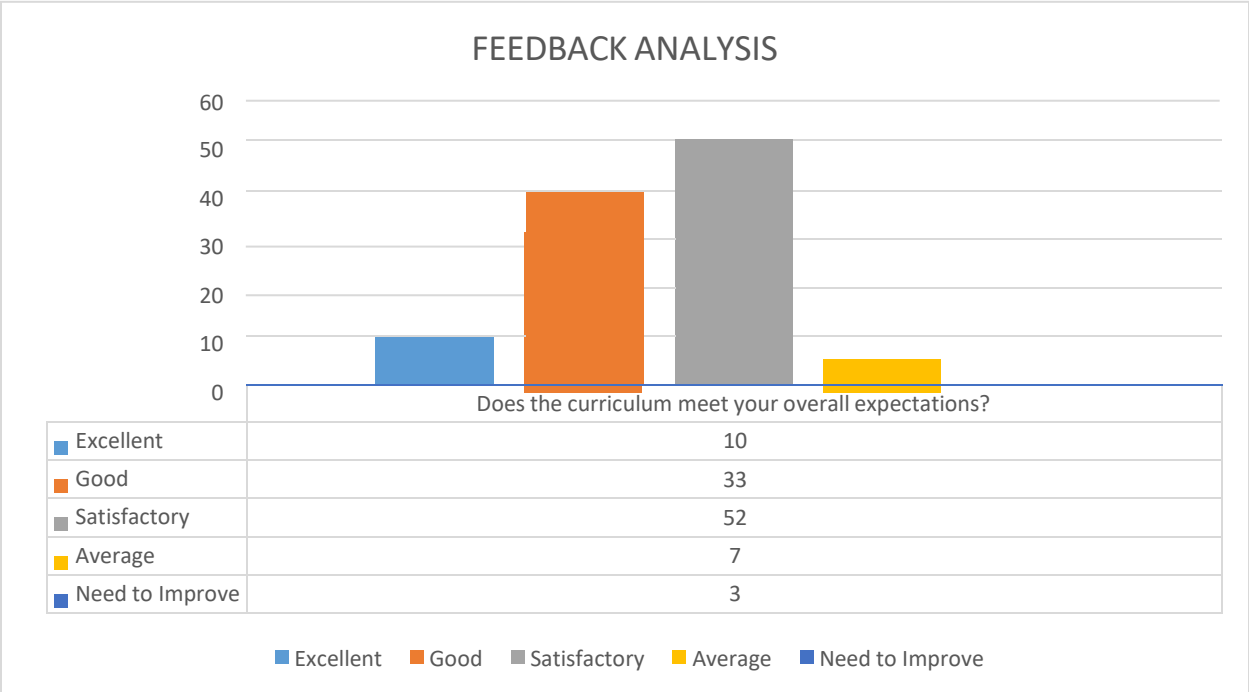



Question 8: Is employability given weightage in the design and development of curriculum?

Report: For the session in 2022-23, 105 students from BALLB, BBALLB from the Batch of 2019, 2020, 2021 & 2022 and from LLM (2022 Batch) gave their feedback on curriculum. The analysis was found ranging from excellent to satisfactory in terms of score. There were few responses that was ranging from better to average. Scope for improvement in terms of score was noticed in pointers including session plan to be provided to students in the beginning of the semester before the classes begin and incorporation of assignments that include more components of critical thinking.

Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report

School of Law, (Christ Deemed to be University), Delhi – NCR distributed curriculum feedback forms were distributed in classrooms at the end of the semester to students from BALLB, BBALLB and LLM courses in 2022-2023. Student feedbacks are taken at the end of every semester to understand the needs of the students and to incorporate their suggestions through the curriculum development cell at School of Law. In addition, feedbacks are also taken from few parents and teachers to ensure fair and unbiased suggestions. As per the analysis, most of the students were satisfied with the various aspects of the curriculum including incorporation of contemporary areas, subjects catering to jobs and future aspirations in the field of law.

Suggestions by students:

1. Students were of the opinion that the coursework should focus more on research and publications.
2. Students also made suggestions on new, innovative and evolving techniques of teaching to attain outcome-based education.
3. Students also proposed that the curriculum should include few more courses that suit their employability expectations and challenges.


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ACTION TAKEN REPORT 2022-2023


In view of the feedback analysis, the gaps in the syllabus as per the requirement of various stakeholders, the department has taken the feedback on curriculum from the students, faculties, alumni, industry experts and parents. Suggestions to revise the syllabus with the inclusion of components of: Internationalization of curriculum; Service learning; and Interdisciplinary approaches were consolidated and discussed in IQAC and CDC, then communicated to the subject teachers. It was decided in the meetings that this feedback report be communicated to University. The above changes were put forth in the Board of Studies meeting in March 2023, and 22.33% of curriculum revision was brought about in both BALLB, BBALLB and LLM courses which included components of service learning, interdisciplinary approach and international relevance.

As suggested by the IQAC, CDC and BOS following actions were prominently taken:


1. Skill Enhancement Value Added Course on Mediation, Negotiation and Arbitration and Contract Drafting Workshop was conducted for second and third year law students in collaboration with industry experts to provide them practical training on ADR and drafting of Contract.
2. Lectures were organized by foreign law professors to build international connect
3. Lectures by industry experts and workshops on different fields of law to inculcate interests in subjects were organized.
4. Regular alumni meet-ups and interaction to understand their practical experiences and learn from their journeys beyond law school
5. More research-based committees have been introduced to engage co-curricular interests of students, such as Intellectual Property and Allied Rights Committee, Human Rights and Gender Equity Committee
6. Bridge course has been introduced for slow learners. For the same, a test was conducted of specific areas of law, and any student who fails to get 40% marks in that subject had to attend bridge course and remedial classes so that he can receive personal attention

7. Group mentoring sessions were held, with a specific pre-approved schedule, such as on topics like building CV, how to write cover letter etc.
8. Faculty development programs and Quality improvement programs to equip faculty members with new areas of law have been undertaken.
9. Teacher-student collaborations were encouraged for the purposes of research writing

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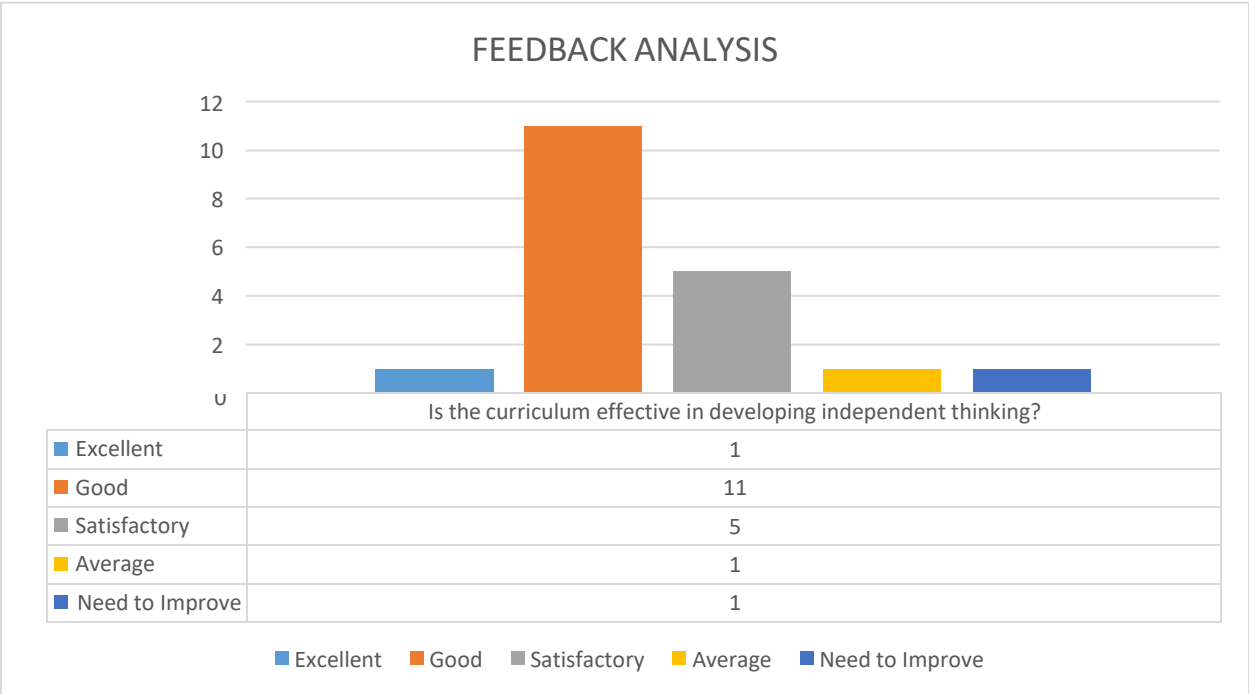


Question 1: Does the curriculum satisfy the stated objectives and learning outcomes?


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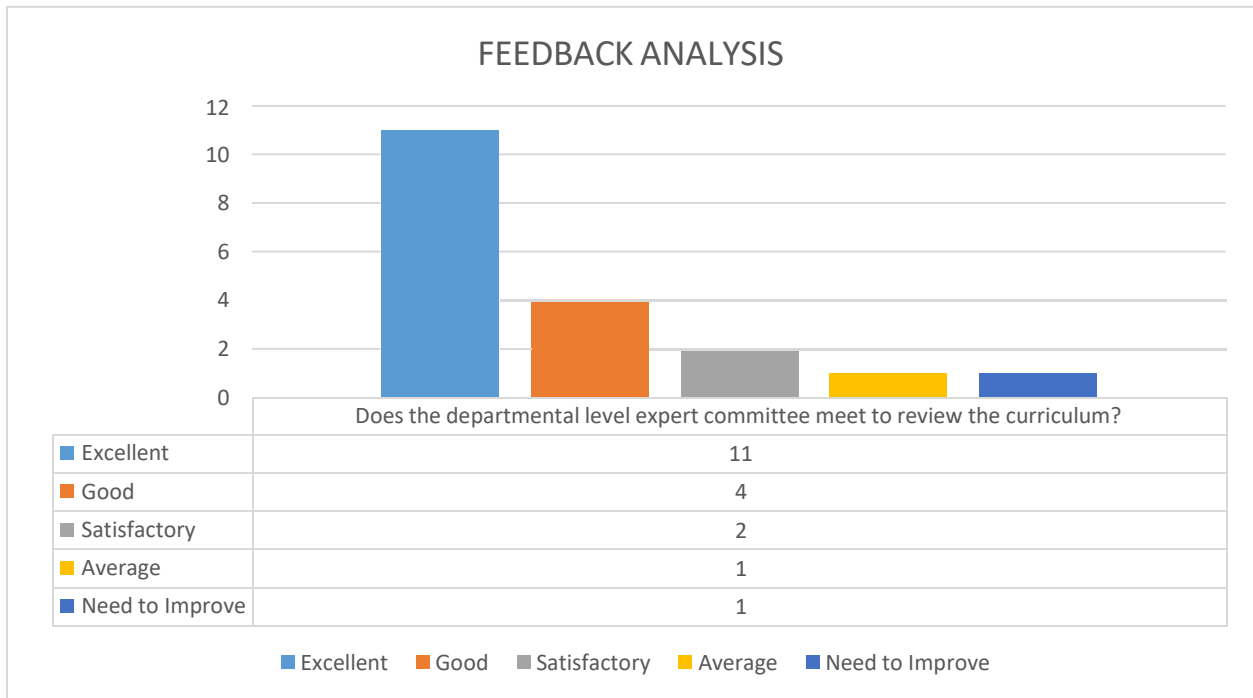


Question 2: Do you have continuous processes to propose, modify, suggest and incorporate new topics in the curriculum?

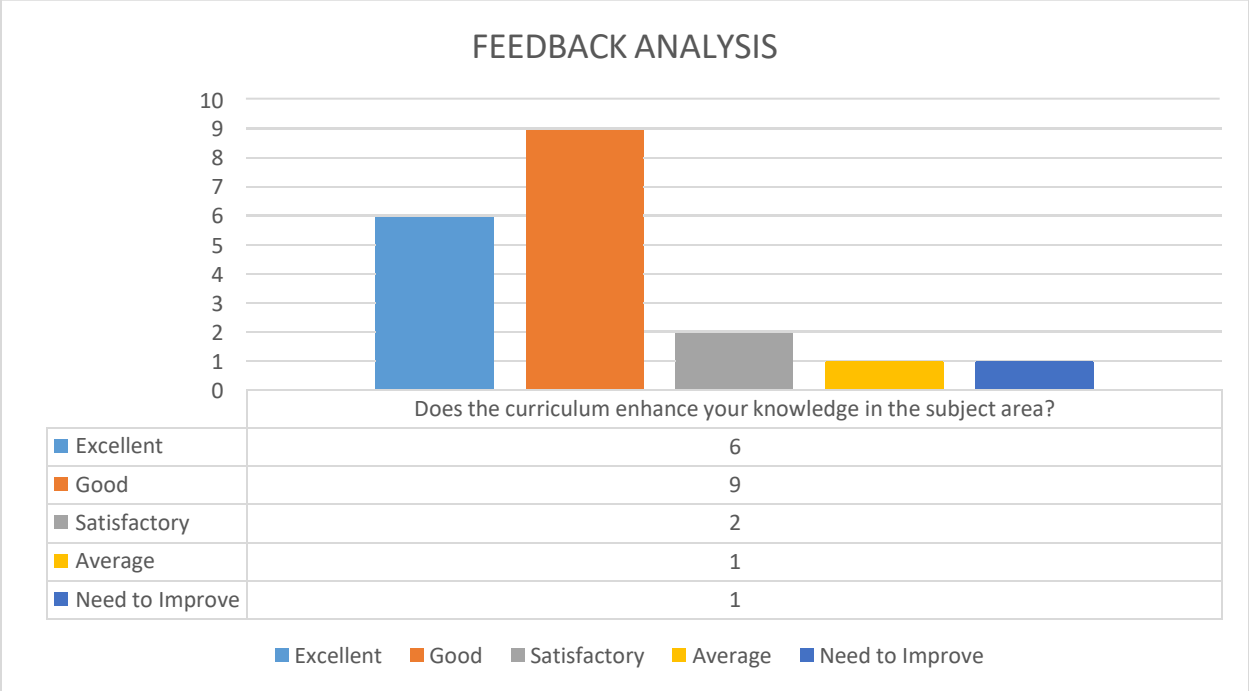



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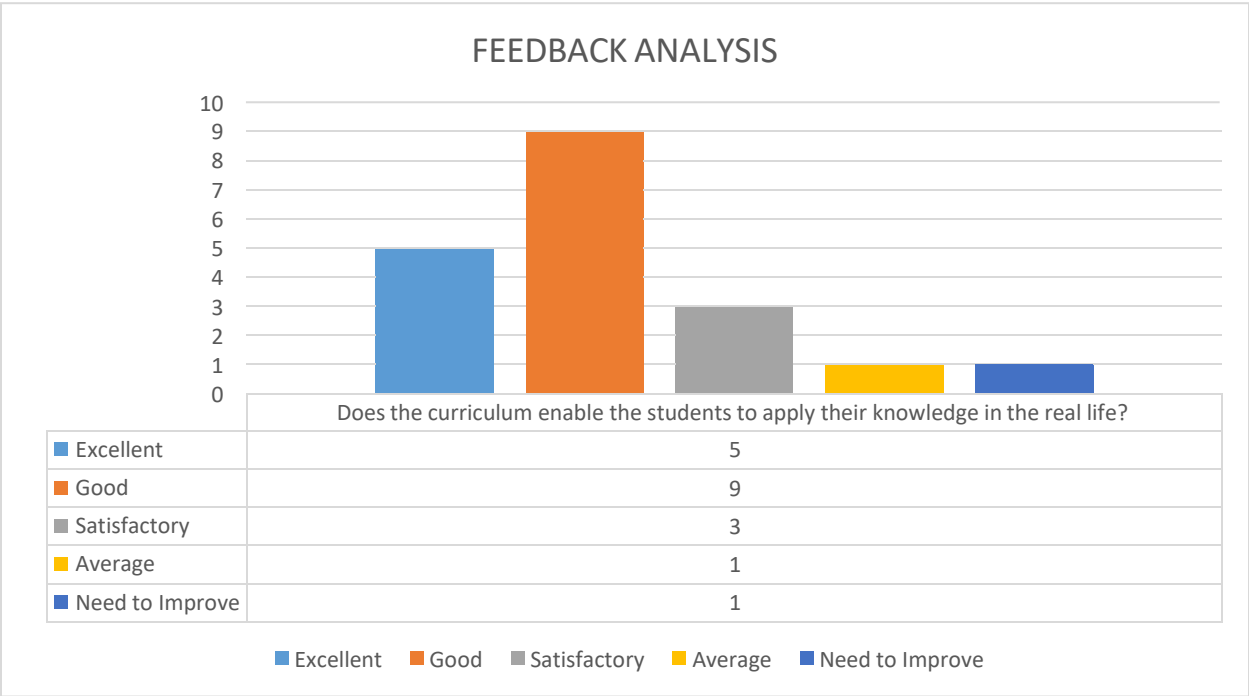

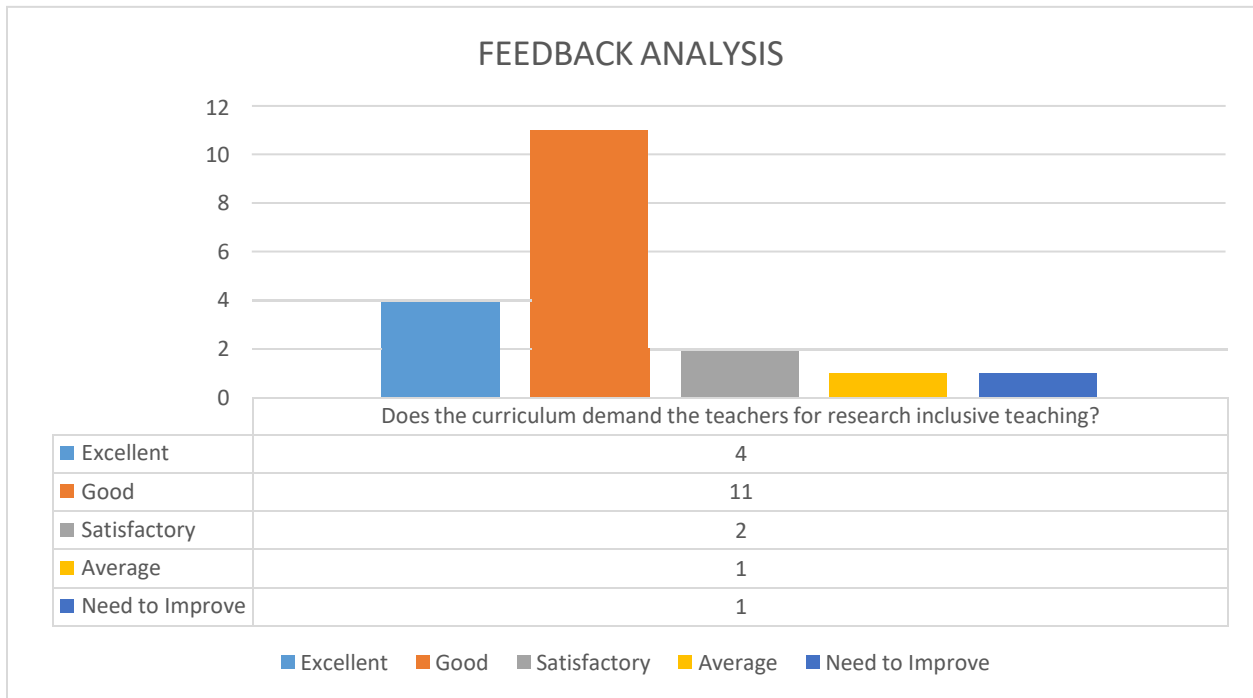


Question 5: Does the curriculum enhance your knowledge in the subject area?

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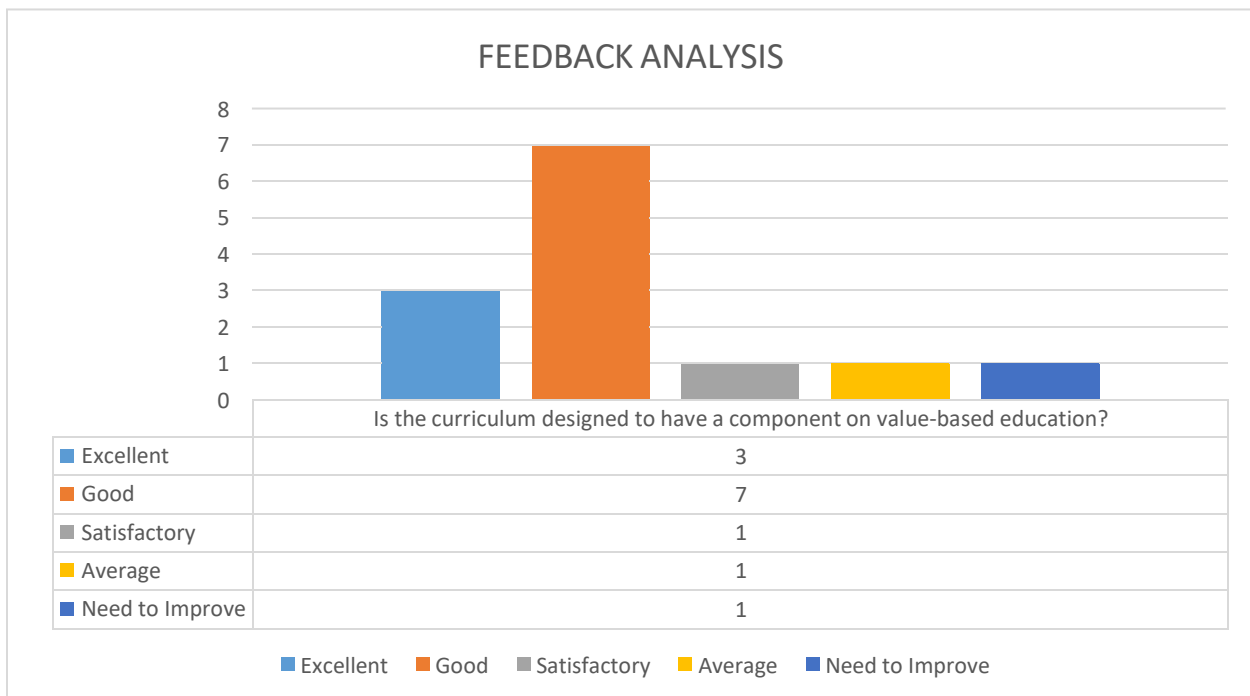


Question 1: Does the curriculum orient the Students towards Higher Education?

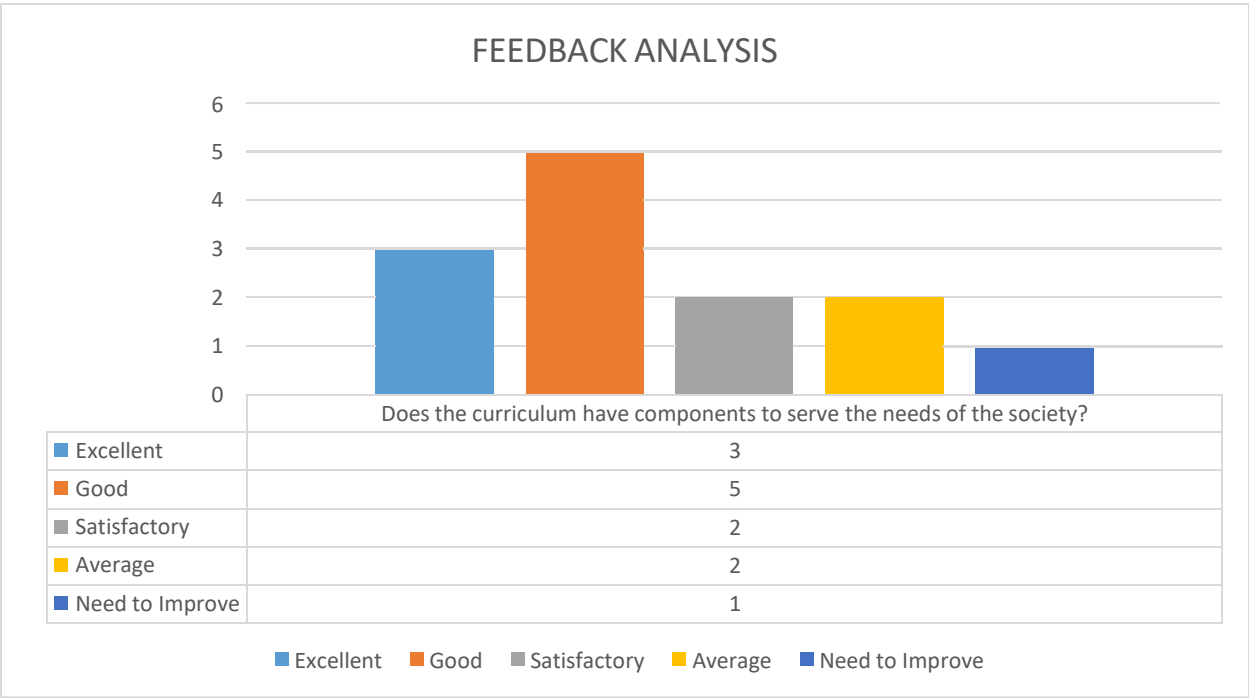

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Question 2: Is employability given weightage in the design and development of the Curriculum?

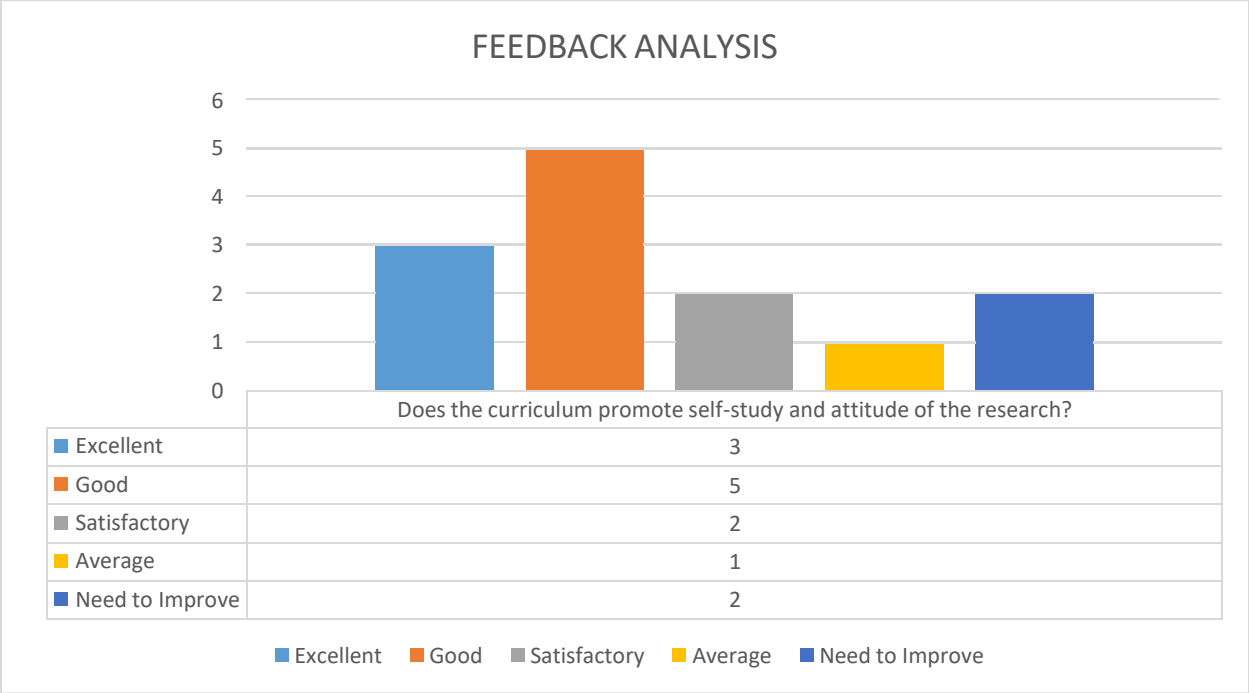


Question 3: Is the curriculum designed to have a component on value-based education?

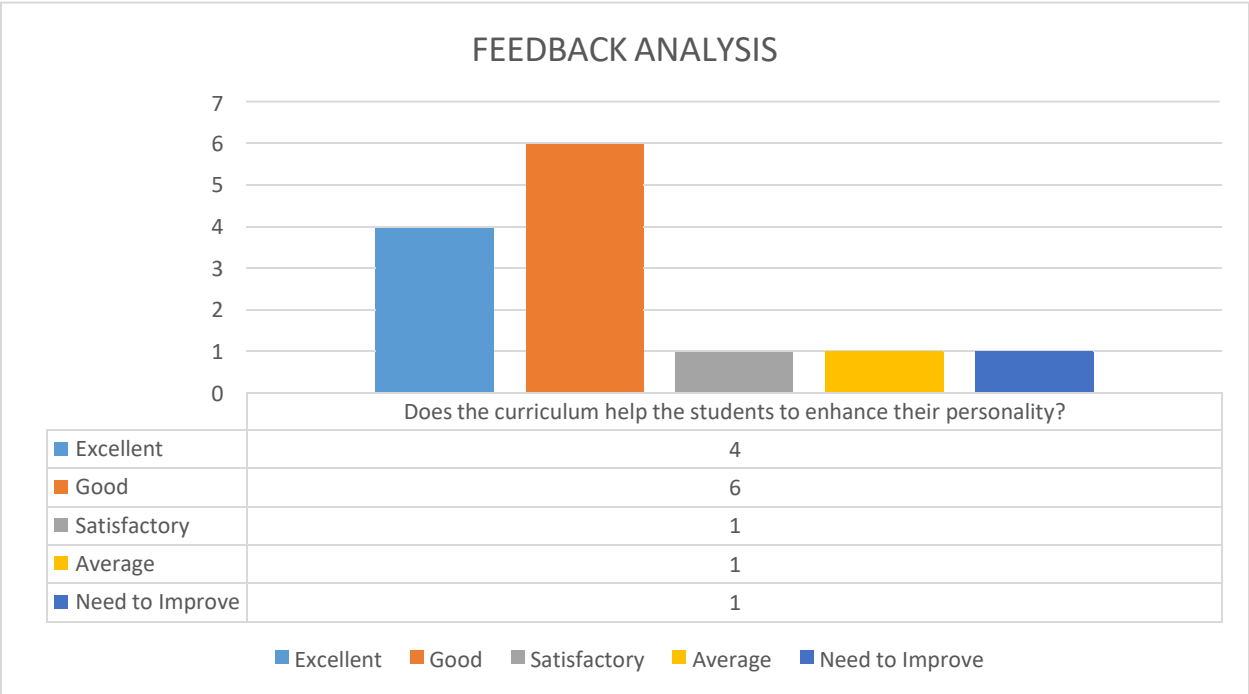

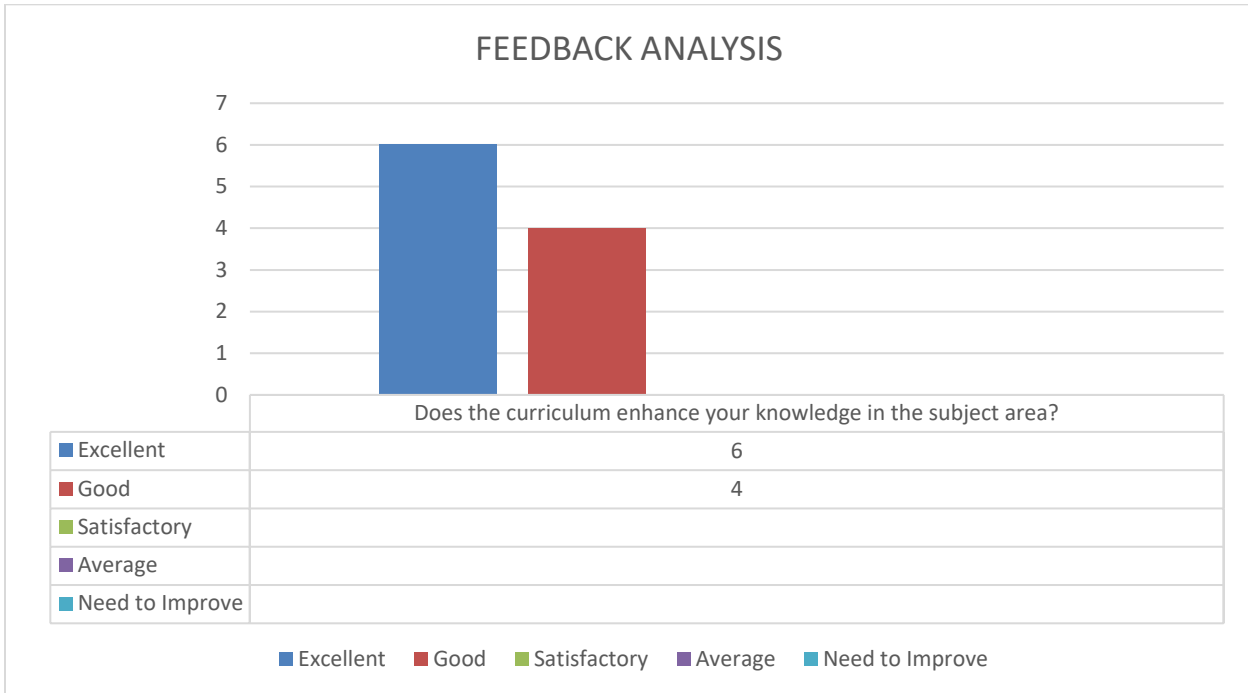
Question 2: Does the curriculum orient the students towards higher education?



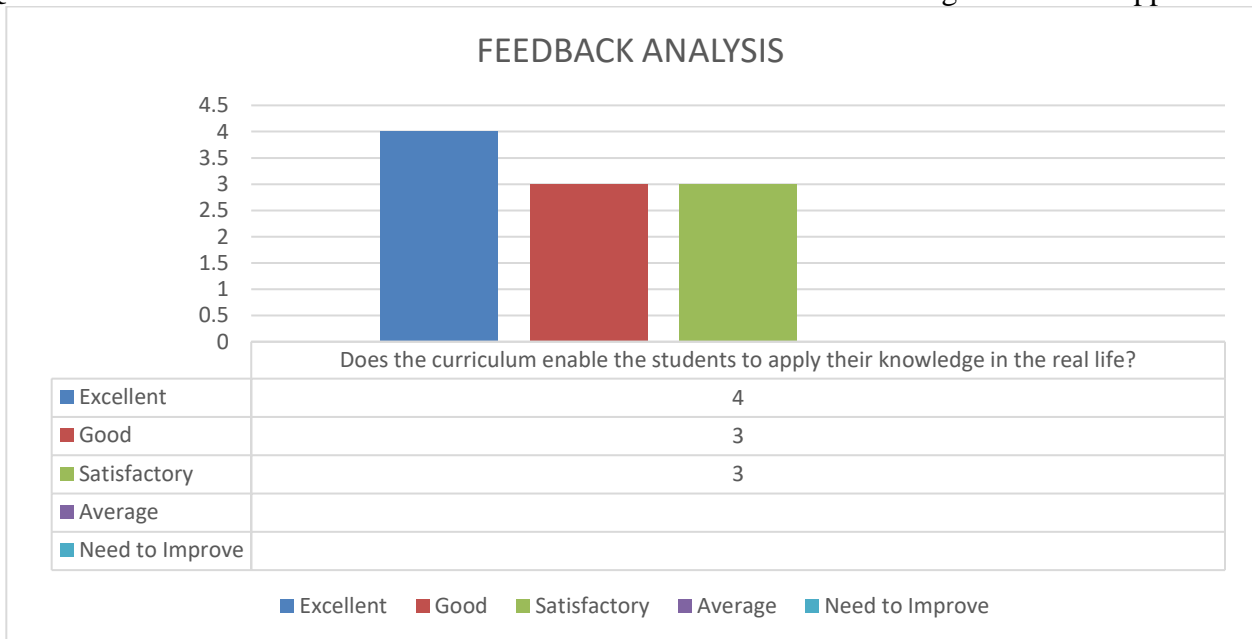

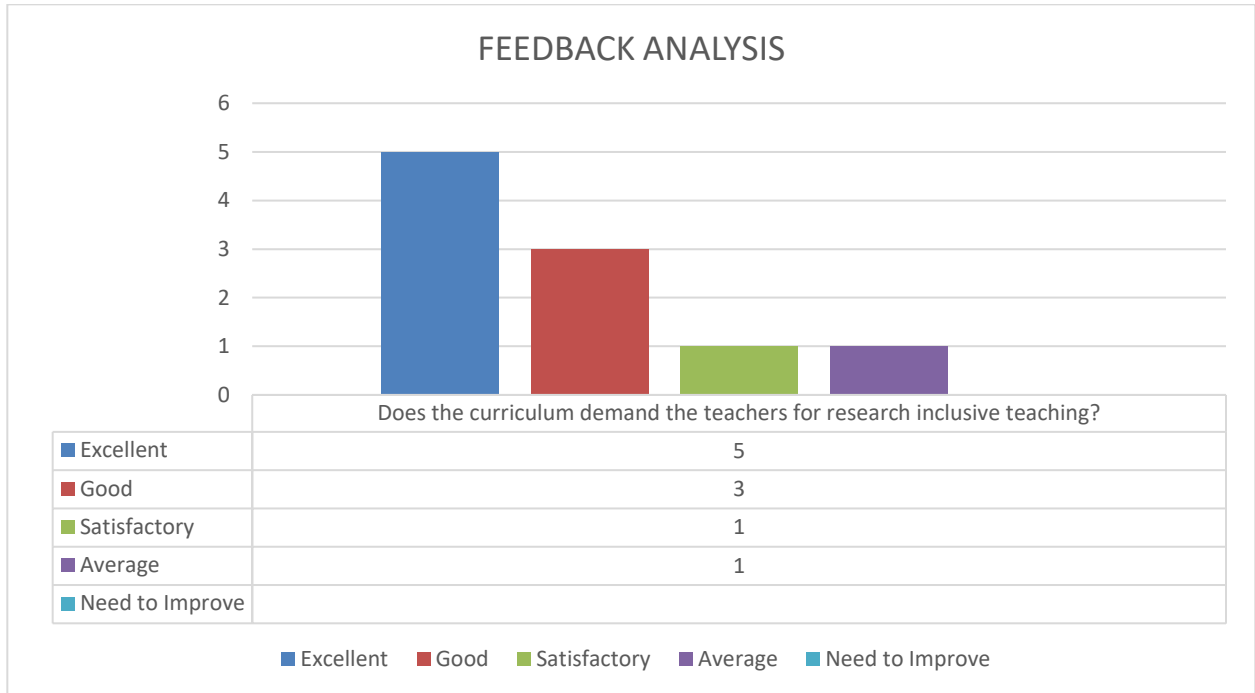
